SERVING OUR SCHOOLS

Alongside our offer of instrumental teaching across schools in Southend, we are delighted to bring to our school colleagues our provision for the 2025–26 academic year.

All of our provision is inclusive, designed to support you and your school as part of the personal, social, academic and developmental journey of your young people through music.

DISCOUNTS

We offer a highly subsidised tuition discount of up to 50% for applicants who are eligible as detailed in the policy conditions on our website. We also offer support for Looked After Children (LAC) or Post-Looked After Children (PLAC) to access fully-subsidised lessons.

SEND SUPPORT

Our staff are trained in working with students with Special Educational Needs (SEND) on a day-to-day basis, working with the school. We also have a number of specialist staff working in SEND settings and are trained to work with a broad range of students with needs.

GREATER ESSEX MUSIC HUB

Music On Sea is a key partner in the Greater Essex Music Hub. The Greater Essex Music Hub works with partners and stakeholders to deliver the National Plan for Music Education and ensure that the young people of Essex, Southend and Thurrock have access and opportunity to develop and flourish as musicians.

WHOLE CLASS INSTRUMENTAL TUITION

'Start every young persons musical journey by learning to play an instrument within a whole class setting.

Pupils from KS1-3 learn to play a musical instrument as a class alongside their teacher led by a specialist music tutor from Music on Sea. They will learn what it means to be a musician, developing understanding and skills needed for musical learning through learning to play an instrument.

SUPPORTING INSTRUMENTAL LEARNING

We want to ensure that all children at KS2 have the chance to learn an instrument while they are in primary school. We have a limited number of spaces to support schools in the following ways:

 Funded term of lessons for 1 year group at KS2, ideally year 4 (limited availability and schools without music specialist teachers will be prioritised)

 Book two terms of lessons and Music-on-Sea will fund a further term, meaning pupils get a year of instrumental learning for £750 per class

 If you have a music specialist, we have resources to support teaching and instruments for hire to schools

 We can arrange workshops and events over the year to provide performance opportunities for young musicians

KS3 – We can support a limited number of schools through investing in our Endangered Orchestral Instruments programme, delivering sessions through small-group sessions.

CURRICULUM RESOURCES

A suite of online curriculum resources to support all aspects of the music curriculum delivery in school.

We work with our partners to provide training and Continuing Professional Development (CPD) for you to get the best use of the resources in school across the year.

We offer a variety of resources including Charanga Musical School, Sing Up and Sparkyard at Primary level, Charanga Secondary (including VIP Studios), Focus on Sound, and Sing Up at Secondary level, and we work with each SEND setting to find the best fit using these resources.

Charanga

This is an online music platform that contains resources for all areas of curriculum and extra-curricular musical activities in primary, secondary and SEND settings.

YuStudio

YuStudio is a cloud based digital audio workstation (DAW) with all the features you would expect from a professional DAW but with no seat limits. Being cloud based students can work from home so it is ideal for homework and learning beyond the classroom.





This is a cloud-based curriculum music support for KS3-5, including materials for GCSE and A Level examinations.

Sing Up

Discounted membership for an online resource that embeds singing into the heart of your school. Schools who subscribe to access Charanga or Focus on Sound receive a 50% discount on Sing Up. All other schools receive a 25% discount. This does not apply to the Small Secondary Package.

Sparkyard

Discounted membership for an online resource that embeds singing into the heart of your school. All Southend schools can receive 30% discount to Sparkyard membership.

We can work with each SEND setting to find the best fit using these resources.

WORKSHOPS

Drum Workshops

As part of the Greater Essex Music Hub, we offer intermediate ensembles including our Young People's Orchestra through to our flagship ensembles such as Essex Youth Orchestra. All of these celebrate bringing young people together through making music with each other.

Terms and Conditions

Our terms and conditions are published annually and are held on our website.

Our provision is offered subject to availability of workforce and budget where appropriate.

Our notice periods for ongoing provision are at the half-term holiday of each term to end at that term.

Quality assurance

We run a comprehensive CPD programme for our tutors in order to develop and support them as well as ensuring they can bring their best when working in your setting.

Tutors are also visited annually by senior leadership for observation and feedback.

Safeguarding

All music service staff are part of Southendon-Sea City Council, and as such undergo a minimum requirement of biennial ESCB Level 2 Safeguarding & Child Protection training.

Our tutors are DBS checked and we are moving all tutors onto the DBS update service. We provide Single Central Records requests for settings as appropriate.
